# LIEUTENANT COLONEL DANIEL W. SULLIVAN

Lt Col Daniel W. Sullivan is the Commander of Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps (AFROTC) Detachment 290 and Professor of Aerospace Studies at the University of Kentucky (UK). Lt Col Sullivan is responsible for training and developing more than 80 cadets in becoming Air and Space Force professionals and leaders dedicated to serving our Nation. He commands, directs, manages, and administers a college-level training and commissioning program with a seven-person cadre leading a large detachment cadet corps. As the Aerospace Studies Department Chair, he collaborates with UK leadership and staff to ensure program success and development within the College of Arts and Sciences.

Lt Col Sullivan entered military service after graduating from the University of Kentucky and receiving his commission through AFROTC in 2005. Since then, he has held various duty positions at multiple bases, most recently the Deputy Commander of the 5th Operations Group. There he led over 350 combat-ready professionals and a fleet of 27 B-52H bombers to project conventional and nuclear power around the globe supporting two legs of the nuclear triad. Lt Col Sullivan served as the Director of Operations of the 5th Operations Support



Squadron leading 197 personnel across 30 different duty specialty codes empowering 57,000 flights, 150 ICBMs, 165,000 alert hours and \$5 billion in Department of Defense assets. He was key to the 5 BW winning the Castle Award for best bomb wing twice in a three-year period. Lt Col Sullivan was the Deputy Branch Chief in charge of the USNORTHCOM Consolidated Command Center (CCC) and a certified Nuclear Command and Control Strike Advisor. He was responsible for developing nuclear strategic courses of action for the Combatant Commander to advise the President and Secretary of Defense in contingency and crisis action events. Additionally, at USNORTHCOM, Lt Col Sullivan was a certified strategic Nuclear Command and Control planner advising six General and Flag officers during all phases of military operations and a Custodian for a \$5.5 million and 2,100 item Positive Control Material account ensuring National Command, Control and Communication. He has been an Assistant Director of Operations twice, a leader in Weapons and Tactics and Flight Scheduling, and a Formal Training Unit instructor.

Lt Col Sullivan is a Distinguished Graduate of the U.S. Air Force Weapons School and an Evaluator Weapon Systems Officer with more than 2,100 hours in the B-52H.
